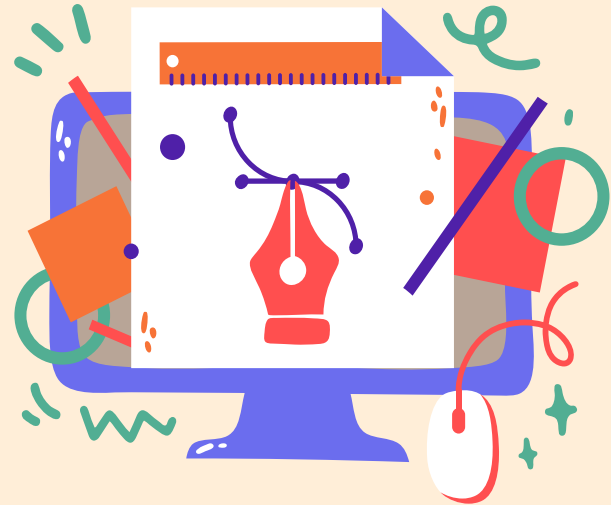
WHAT IS TITLE 1?

- Title I is part of the Elementary and Secondary School Act of 1965 which was reauthorized as the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA).
- Title 1 is a federally funded program



What is the purpose of Title 1?

The purpose of this title is to ensure that all children have a fair, equal, and significant opportunity to obtain a high-quality education and reach, at a minimum, proficiency on challenging state academic achievement standards and state academic assessments.



How does a school qualify as Title 1?

- Title 1 qualification is determined by the percentage of students on free and reduced lunch.
- Over 50 % of Star View students qualify for free and reduced lunch.



What does Title 1 do for my student?

The Title 1 program provides your student with extra educational assistance.

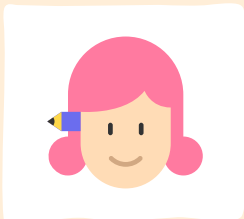

STATE ASSESSMENT



- California public schools utilize the Smarter Balanced Assessment System. This system consists of computer-adaptive tests and performance tasks that allow students to show what they know and are able to do. This system is based on the Common Core State Standards (CCSS) for English Language Arts/literacy (ELA) and mathematics.
- Achievement Level Descriptors include Standard Exceeded, Standard Met, Standard Nearly Met and Standard Not Met.
- All students are expected to make progress and score at minimum at **Standard Met**.
