## CSEA Tentative Agreement Approved; 'May Revise' Budget Explained; District & School Volunteers Recognized

### Ocean View School District Honors Key Volunteers for Commitment to Schools

Event planner, snack-maker, president, artist, reader, fundraiser – It is all in a day's work when you are a school volunteer. In a special recognition ceremony at the regular Board meeting, 51 volunteers were honored for the work they do throughout the year on behalf of the District's more than 8,700 preschool to grade 8 students. Volunteers recognized ranged from moms, dads and grandparents to community business leaders and service organization members. On a sad note, Village View Elementary School lost one of its beloved, long-time volunteers this year, Ms. Pam Potter, also known as "Grandma Pam." ### State's 'May Revise' Budget Shows Increased Revenues, Contingent One-Time Funding

Deputy Superintendent Michael Conroy presented the Board with an explanation of the details of Governor Jerry Brown's "May Revise" budget. The May Revision reflects higher revenues for 2017-18 due to a modest increase in personal income and corporation taxes. Regarding Prop 98 funding, Dr. Conroy explained that all of the one-time funding for 2017-18 (approx. \$1B) is a contingent appropriation, with funds only available in May 2019 if the Prop 98 Guarantee for 2017-18 remains at \$74.6B or higher. Dr. Conroy discussed increasing pension costs, which will put the squeeze on base revenues. The state Administration continues to signal an upcoming recession. The Governor has been quick to point out that the current recovery is the third longest in the post-war period, and notes that if there is not a recession within the next two years, it would be historic. However, the current Budget forecast does not project a recession and, in fact, reflects continued growth over the next four years. To view the presentation, [link here!](#)

### Measure R Bond Update: Project Timelines, Current Status and Next Steps

Superintendent Carol Hansen updated the Board on Measure R bond project timelines, current status and next steps. The Board recently approved architect and construction management firms for the upcoming projects and approved the sale of bonds, which will be completed by June 1. Dr. Hansen summarized recent task force meetings convened to discuss interim housing during modernization and school consolidation projects involving Sun View and OVPP/Pleasant View Schools. Recommendations from the District, following task force input and deliberations, will go the Board for Public Hearing on June 6, followed by Board action at the June 13 meeting. ### CSEA Tentative Agreement Passes, Management/Confidential Salary Schedule Increased

The Board approved the CSEA and its Chapter 375 tentative settlement agreement for the 2016-2017 school year. In order to allow parity with OVTA and CSEA tentative agreements for 2016-2017, the Board also approved an increase in the Management/Confidential Salary Schedule as follows: Effective July 1, 2016, 2% increase and effective January 1, 2017, an additional 1% increase.
