Mesa View Modernization

Mr. Keith Farrow, Assistant Superintendent of Administrative Services, presented the Board with options to review regarding the Mesa View modernization scheduled for the 2023-24 school year. Measure R Citizens' Oversight Committee Annual Report

Mr. Mark Bixby, Chair of the Measure R Citizens' Oversight Committee, presented the Committee's 2022 Annual Report to the Board, which included committee meeting dates, Measure R project updates, a financial summary, and an explanation of the Committee's activities. Committee Chair Bixby reported that the Ocean View School District is in compliance with Article XIIIA, section 1(b)(3) of the California Constitution, that states all proceeds were used for school improvement projects authorized under Measure R.

Expanded Learning Opportunities Program

Dr. Julianne Hoefer, Assistant Superintendent of Educational Services, presented an overview of the Expanded Learning Opportunities Program, which provides school districts the opportunity to supplement instruction and support to students, including those identified as needing academic, social-emotional, and other supports, including the provision of meals and snacks. Expanded Learning Opportunities are academic and learning programs that exist outside of regular school hours, such as after school and during summer. Dr. Hoefer shared that the Expanded Learning Opportunities Program can meet the needs of students by extending instructional learning time with increasing the number of instructional days or minutes provided during the school year; providing summer school or intersessional instructional programs; or taking any other action that increases the amount of instructional time or services provided to students based on their learning needs. School districts can also leverage community-based organizations to provide these programs. See the presentation here.
